All these fees will be collected at the time of admission

- Caution deposit of Rs. 360/- for B.Ed and Rs. 600/- for M.Ed. will be collected at the time of admission. Students should keep the fee receipts issued from the office.
- 2. If any student fails to pay the fees or special fees on the due date he/she shall be liable to pay a fine of Rs 5 along with the fees on or before the 10th day after the due date. If the 10th day happens to be a holiday, the next working day will be counted as 10th day
- 3. If the fees with a fine of Rs 5 is not paid on or before the 10th day after the due date, an additional fine of Rs.10 will have to be paid and if the fees and fine are not paid within 15 days from the due date, the name of the student will be removed from the rolls of the college with effect from the date following the expiry of this period and the student shall not get the benefit of attendance from the date of removal and if the student is to be re-admitted he/she has to apply for the special permission of the principal and also has to remit all the arrears of fees with fine. The re-admitted students shall get the benefit of attendance only from the date of re-admission.
- 4. If the student leaves the college during the middle of a term he/ she shall pay the tuition fees for that term
- 5. The university examination fee for B.Ed and M.Ed will be notified by the university for all Semesters.
- 6. Graduates from other universities should remit Rs.135 (Rs. 50 for recognition of the qualifying degree and Rs. 190 for Matriculation in the University of Calicut)

Refund of caution deposit

The Caution Deposit shall be refunded when the students leave the college after deducting dues if any. They shall apply in the prescribed form immediately before the expiry of the academic year or at the time of leaving the college, in case they discontinue in the middle of the academic year. If the claim for refund is not made before the date of re-opening the college for the next academic year, the amount will be forfeited and remitted to the general revenue account of the Government as per rules. The original receipt issued for remittance of caution deposit is to be produced along with the application.

Fee Concession and Scholarship

Full fee concession is granted to students on production of necessary income, nativity, and community certificates. A number of scholarships are awarded every year to students belonging to the backward classes by the government of India. Students of the college are eligible also for Merit scholarship awarded by the Government of India and University.

General Rules of Conduct

- 1. Students shall always behave with dignity and courtesy.
- 2. Students should always carry their identity cards in the college.
- 3. Students shall be clean and decent in appearance and dress.
- 4. The students should wear uniform, as suggested by the college.
- 5. Students shall leave lecture hall quietly.
- 6. Crowding on the verandah and door way and shouting etc. will be treated as act of indiscipline.
- 7. No student shall leave the lecture hall when the class or guest lecture is in progress, except for an unavoidable reason. Leaving without permission is highly irregular.
- 8. Students shall be in their seats 5 minutes before the commencement of the class.
- 9. No late comer shall enter the class without permission of the lecturer concerned.
- Students are expected to be in the library when they have no class. Loitering on the verandah and in the premises will be treated as indiscipline.
- 11. Students are forbidden from entering the laboratory except with the consent of the lecturer in charge.
- 12. Furniture should not be misplaced and dislocated.
- 13. Students are warned not to participate in any agitation against authority nor should they engage in any activity promoting communal or religious disharmony.
- 14. Addressing any gathering in the premises without the permission of the principal is irregular except for college union activities.
- 15. No student shall appear for an interview without prior permission of the principal.
- 16. Any office bearer of the college union if found to be repeatedly violating the rules of conduct will be relieved from the office he holds.
- 17. Banners, flags, posters etc. shall not be allowed inside the campus and at the gate for the purpose of any activity without the permission of the Principal.

- No certificate will be issued from the college unless the principal is satisfied with the reason stated by the applicant for such certificate.
- 19. Application for certificate should be made at least two days in advance.
- 20. Conduct certificate will ordinarily be issued only along with the transfer certificate when the student has completed the course.
- 21. Ragging of any form is a non-bailable offence and required criminal procedure.
- 22. Outsiders are not permitted to attend or organise any programme or activity without the permission of the principal.

REGULARITY AND PUNCTUALITY

Students should be regular and punctual in attendance. Late comers shall be permitted to attend further sessions only after the ratification of genuine reason by the authority.

LEAVE AND ATTENDANCE RULES

- Students are not permitted to absent themselves without leave. Application for leave in the prescribed form should be submitted sufficiently earlier.
- 2. Absence without leave for part of a day and full day will be regarded as absence for one day and two days respectively.
- 3. Absence for 15 consecutive working days will be considered sufficient reason for removal of his / her name from the rolls.
- 4. Leave may be granted for not more than 10 days at a stretch including holidays in the case of unavoidable reasons (illness etc.,), Additional leave may be given on producing certificates from a registered Medical Practitioner.
- 5. Attendance certificate required by the University for admission to University examinations will not be granted unless the principal is satisfied with the conduct and progress of the student. A student shall be considered to have satisfactory attendance to appear the university examination as per the university rules

Library Rules

- 1. All students of the college must make use of the library to enrich their academic excellence.
- 2. The library shall be kept opened from 8.30 am to 4.30 pm on working days.
- Keeping in mind that the library is a place of individual study and research, members should refrain from engaging in conversations, maintain proper behaviour and cleanliness within the library premises.
- 4. Every student has to record their attendence in the gate register at the entrance before entering the library.
- Barcoded library membership card is a must for making use of library facility. Members are entitled to borrow books on production of membership card and borrower's cards issued to them. And the same sould be returned at the end of the academic session.
- 6. Loss of books and borrowers cards must be reported immediately

in writing to the librarian.

- 7. The number of books issued to a post graduate student at a time will not be more than six, B.Ed students not more than four and Research Scholars not more than three.
- 8. Readers tickets/ library membership cards are not transferable.
- 9. Reference books and periodicals are not issued out.
- 10. Dissertation/ Thesis are to be consulted within the library premises only.
- 11. Borrowers must satisfy themselves with the physical condition of the books before borrowing and if they are not in good condition, the fact should be brought to the notice of the librarian. Students shall not damage or mark upon any book/ journal belonging to the library.
- Students are not allowed to bring personal books or any printed material and other personal belongings except writing materials inside the library.
- 13. Library materials may not be removed from the library unless they are properly issued out.
- 14. Books shall be issued from / returned to the library at the time and in the manner notified in the library from time to time.
- 15. Books may not be retained by any students for more than two weeks.
- Absence from college will not be admitted as an excuse for delay in returning books.
- Those who return the books should see that the necessary entries are made in the issue register regarding the returning of books.
- 18. A fine of Re. 1/- per book per day will be levied for delay in returning books.
- 19. Members shall replace books lost or pay the estimated cost for them as per rules from time to time.

- 20. Students shall not on any account sub lend library books.
- 21. The librarian may recall a book at any time even when the normal period of loan is not over.
- 22. All members of the staff of the college are members of the library. A member of the teaching staff may borrow up to 10 books at a time. A member of the non-teaching staff may borrow 5 books at a time.
- 23. Ordinarily books will not be issued to non members. In exceptional cases the principal may permit a non-member to have access to library or to borrow books on such terms the principal determines.
- 24. All books taken from the library will have to be returned to the library at the time of stock verification.
- 25. Do not replace books on shelves. A misplaced book is a lost book.
- Misbehavior and indiscipline will lead to cancellation of membership and disciplinary action. Use of mobile phones also forbidden.
- 27. By the act of using any facility of the library users agrees to abide by the rules of library.

Reading room rules

- c. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- **d.** Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- **e.** Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- **f.** Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- g. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- h. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;
- i. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

The harmoniously and symmetrically arranged college emblem presents a mix of nearly ten significant ingredients viz, a flaming torch in a firmly holding hand; a star at the centre; the motto of the institution with the name of the institution inscribed underneath; coconut trees and a sea coast; an open book; ink-pot and pen; and an encircling crescent.
