All these fees will be collected at the time of admission

1. Caution deposit of Rs. 360/- for B.Ed and Rs. 600/- for M.Ed. will be collected at the time of admission. Students should keep the fee receipts issued from the office.
2. If any student fails to pay the fees or special fees on the due date he/she shall be liable to pay a fine of Rs 5 along with the fees on or before the 10th day after the due date. If the 10th day happens to be a holiday, the next working day will be counted as 10th day
3. If the fees with a fine of Rs 5 is not paid on or before the 10th day after the due date, an additional fine of Rs. 10 will have to be paid and if the fees and fine are not paid within 15 days from the due date, the name of the student will be removed from the rolls of the college with effect from the date following the expiry of this period and the student shall not get the benefit of attendance from the date of removal and if the student is to be re-admitted he/she has to apply for the special permission of the principal and also has to remit all the arrears of fees with fine. The re-admitted students shall get the benefit of attendance only from the date of re-admission.
4. If the student leaves the college during the middle of a term he/she shall pay the tuition fees for that term
5. The university examination fee for B.Ed and M.Ed will be notified by the university for all Semesters.
6. Graduates from other Universities should remit Rs.195 for Matriculation in the University of Calicut and Rs. 250 for re-matriculation

Refund of caution deposit

The Caution Deposit shall be refunded when the students leave the college after deducting dues if any. They shall apply in the prescribed form immediately before the expiry of the academic year or at the time of leaving the college, in case they discontinue in the middle of the academic year. If the claim for refund is not made before the date of re-opening the college for the next academic year, the amount will be forfeited and remitted to the general revenue account of the Government as per rules. The original receipt issued for remittance of caution deposit is to be produced along with the application.

Fee Concession and Scholarship

Full fee concession is granted to students on production of necessary income, nativity, and community certificates. A number of scholarships are awarded every year to students belonging to the backward classes by the government of India. Students of the college are eligible also for Merit scholarship awarded by the Government of India and University.

General Rules of Conduct

1. Students shall always behave with dignity and courtesy.
2. Students should carry their identity cards while on campus.
3. Students shall maintain cleanliness and dress decently.
4. Students should wear the prescribed uniform, as suggested by the college.
5. Students shall leave the lecture hall quietly.
6. Crowding in verandas, doorways, or shouting will be treated as an act of indiscipline.
7. Students shall not leave the lecture hall during a class or guest lecture, except for unavoidable reasons, and only with permission. Leaving without permission will be treated as irregular conduct.
8. Students shall be seated at least five minutes before the commencement of the class.
9. Latecomers may enter the class only with the permission of the concerned lecturer.
10. Students are expected to be in the library during free periods. Loitering in verandas or other areas will be treated as indiscipline.
11. Students may enter laboratories only with the consent of the lecturer in charge.
12. Furniture should not be misplaced or damaged.
13. Students shall not participate in any agitation against authorities or engage in activities promoting communal or religious disharmony.
14. Addressing gatherings on campus without the Principal's permission is prohibited, except for approved college union activities.
15. Students shall not attend interviews without prior permission from the Principal.
16. Any office bearer of the college union who repeatedly violates rules will be removed from office.
17. Banners, flags, and posters shall not be displayed on cam-

pus or at the gates without the Principal's permission.

18. Certificates will be issued only if the Principal is satisfied with the reason stated in the application.
19. Applications for certificates should be submitted at least two days in advance.
20. Conduct certificates will ordinarily be issued only along with the transfer certificate upon course completion.
21. Ragging in any form is a criminal offence and will be dealt with according to law.
22. Outsiders may not attend or organise any programme on campus without prior permission from the Principal.

Regularity and Punctuality

1. Students must be regular and punctual in attendance.
2. Latecomers will be allowed to attend subsequent sessions only with valid reasons approved by the authority.

Leave and Attendance Rules

1. Students shall not absent themselves without prior permission. Applications for leave should be submitted in the prescribed form in advance.
2. Absence without leave, whether for part of a day or a full day, will be treated as absence for the entire day.
3. Absence for 15 consecutive working days may result in removal of the student's name from the rolls.
4. Leave for more than 10 days at a stretch (including holidays) will be granted only for unavoidable reasons, supported by a medical certificate if applicable.
5. Attendance certificates required for university examinations will be issued only if the Principal is satisfied with the student's conduct and progress. University rules regarding minimum attendance will be strictly enforced.
6. Absence from class tests or examinations without convincing reasons will be treated as a breach of discipline.

Library Rules and Regulations

1. General Guidelines

1. The college library serves as a vital center for learning, research, and self-development. All students and staff are encouraged to make the best use of its resources to enhance academic excellence.
2. The library shall remain open from 8:30a.m. to 05:00p.m. on all working days.
3. The library is a place for quiet individual study and research. Members must maintain silence, discipline, and cleanliness at all times.
4. Every student is required to record their attendance in the gate register kept at the entrance before entering the library.
5. Use of mobile phones, loud conversation, or any form of disturbance inside the library is strictly prohibited.

2. Membership and Access

1. Members must present their readers tickets when borrowing or returning books.

2. Borrowed materials must be returned at the end of each academic year.
3. Loss of books must be reported immediately in writing to the librarian.
4. The issued books are non-transferable.
5. The library reserves the right to suspend or cancel membership in cases of indiscipline or misuse of privileges.

Additional Rules

1. All books must be properly issued before removal from the library.
2. Reference books, periodicals, dissertations, and theses shall not be issued for home use and must be consulted within the library premises.
3. Borrowers must check the physical condition of books before borrowing and report any damage immediately.
4. Books may be recalled at any time by the librarian, even before the due date.
5. Members should not lend issued books to others.
6. Books must not be marked, underlined, folded, or damaged in any way.

4. Return and Renewal

1. Books must be returned or renewed on or before the due date.
2. A fine of **Re. 1 per book per day** will be charged for overdue books.
3. Absence from the college will not be accepted as a valid reason for delay in returning books
4. Members should ensure that necessary entries are made in the gate entry
5. All borrowed books must be returned during **annual stock verifi-**

cation or when requested by the librarian.

6. Lost books must be replaced with a new copy of the same edition or the cost must be reimbursed as per library policy.

5. Conduct and Discipline

1. The library is a no-mobile zone. Use of mobile phones is strictly forbidden inside the premises.
2. Eating, sleeping, or engaging in loud conversations inside the library is not allowed.
3. Students are not permitted to bring personal books or bags inside the library. Only writing materials may be carried.
4. Members should not attempt to replace books on shelves. Misplaced books will be treated as lost until found.
5. Misbehavior, indiscipline, or damage to library property will invite disciplinary action and cancellation of membership.

6. Special Provisions

1. Normally, books will not be issued to non-members. However, in exceptional cases, the Principal may grant permission for limited access.
2. The librarian, with approval of the Principal, may issue circulars or notifications regarding changes in library rules, timings, or borrowing policies.
3. By availing any facility of the library, members agree to abide by all library rules and regulations as amended from time to time.

Hostel Rules

1. Admission is for two years. Warden reserves the right to grant or deny admission.
2. Parent/guardian should be present at the time of admission.
3. Residents are bound to comply with all the rules of the hostel set down by the college hostel committee.
4. Residents are not permitted to receive or entertain guests including their class/college mates without the prior written permission from the warden.
5. Residents of the hostel should be back at the hostel by 6.00 pm after their class.

6. Use/possession of the following is strictly prohibited: alcoholic drinks, drugs and tobacco products; electrical appliances like iron box, kettle, heating coil and the like.
7. Residents will not have the choice to select their room and room mates.
8. Maintain the rooms and spaces allotted neat and tidy. Safeguard the furnitures and other fittings in the rooms, toilets and other spaces in the hostel.
9. Respect quiet hours and avoid noise.
10. Maintain a cordial and positive attitude and relationship with the residents and employees of the hostel.
11. Ensure to make entries in the movement registers kept at the hostel while leaving and returning to the hostel.
12. Follow mess timings and procedures.
13. Hostel dues of each moth shall be cleared before 15th of next month, failing to which will lead to removal of names from the hostel roll.
14. Ragging is a criminal offence (GO 1157/12/86 HEdn.) and the names of the accused will be forwarded to the Police. They will be immediately dismissed from the hostel
15. Grievances, complaints, suggestions, by the residents can be bought to the notice of the Warden/Matron of the hostel concerned.
16. Decision of the Warden & Principal pertaining to all matters of the hostel will be final.
17. Kindly share any specific health/medical condition with the warden and matron that needs to be taken care of
18. Etiquettes in using resources such as water, food, electricity should be adhered to. Food shall not be ordered to hostel.
19. Dispose plastic/paper/food/sanitary wastes in the allotted bins only.
20. Violations of hostel rules can result in disciplinary action which may include fines, warnings or even expulsion.

- b. Indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;

- c. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- d. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- e. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- f. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- g. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- h. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student ;
- i. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.
