- 1. Caution deposit of Rs. 360/- for B.Ed and Rs. 600/- for M.Ed keep the fee receipts issued from the office.
- the fees on or before the 10th day after the due date. If the 10 day happens to be a holiday, the next working day will be counted as 10th day
- If the fees with a fine of 50 paise is not paid on or before the produced along with the application. 10th day after the due date, an additional fine of Re. 1/- will have to be paid and if the fees and fine are not paid within 15 days Fee Concession and Scholarship from the due date, the name of the student will be removed from the rolls of the college with effect from the date following of attendance from the date of removal and if the student is to fine.
