



All these fees will be collected at the time of admission

- 1. Caution deposit of Rs. 360/- for B.Ed and Rs. 600/- for M.Ed will be collected at the time of admission. Students should keep the fee receipts issued from the office.
- 2. If any student fails to pay the fees or special fees on the dutivear or at the time of leaving the college, in case they discontinue as 10th day
- 10th day after the due date, an additional fine of Re. 1/- will have produced along with the application. to be paid and if the fees and fine are not paid within 15 days from the due date, the name of the student will be removed Fee Concession and Scholarship from the rolls of the college with effect from the date following fine. The re-admitted students shall get the benefit of Government of India and University. attendance only from the date of re-admission.
- 4. If the student leaves the college during the middle of a term he/ she shall pay the tuition fees for that term
- 5. The university examination fee for B.Ed and M.Ed will be notified by the university for all Semesters.
- 6. Graduates from other universities should remit Rs.100/- (Rs. 50/- for recognition of the qualifying degree and Rs. 50/- for Matriculation in the Calicut University)

## Refund of caution deposit

The Caution Deposit shall be refunded when the students leave the college after deducting dues if any. They shall apply in the prescribed form immediately before the expiry of the academic date he/she shall be liable to pay a fine of 50 paise along within the middle of the academic year. If the claim for refund is not the fees on or before the 10th day after the due date. If the 10th made before the date of re-opening the college for the next day happens to be a holiday, the next working day will be counted academic year, the amount will be forfeited and remitted to the general revenue account of the Government as per rules.
